
#### **DG Joint Research Centre**

7 institutes in 5 countries, 2000 people








## **ESDI** Concept







### Principles of INSPIRE

- the Infrastructure for Spatial Information in Europe
- Data collected once and maintained at the level where most effective.
- Spatial information from different sources in Europe combined seamless and shared between users/applications.
- Information collected at one level to be shared between different levels,
  - detailed for detailed investigations; general for strategic purposes.
- Gl needed for good governance to be available under conditions that do not refrain its extensive use.
- Easy discovering which geographic information is available, relevant for particular use and under which conditions to acquire and use.





### Proposal for the INSPIRE Directive



INSPIRE lays down **general rules** for the establishment of an infrastructure for spatial information in Europe to support:

- environmental policies and
- policies that affect the environment

This infrastructure shall be based on infrastructures for spatial information established and operated by the Member States.

INSPIRE requires also specific implementing rules to be adopted through Commitology

Legal Notice

#### Whom does it concern?

- This Directive is without prejudice to Directive 2003/4/EC, save where otherwise provided.
- This Directive is without prejudice to Directive 2003/98/EC.

#### Article 4

In the case of spatial data sets held by or on behalf of a public authority in accordance with Article 2(1)(c), where that authority operates at the lowest level of government within a Member State, this Directive shall apply only to spatial data sets the collection or dissemination of which is coordinated by another public authority or is required under national law.

#### **Despite:**

Article 5

The following shall be regarded as a public authority for the purposes of this Directive:

- government or other public administration, including public advisory bodies, at national, regional or local level;
- any natural or legal person performing public administrative functions under national law, including specific duties, activities or services in relation to the environment;
- (c) any natural or legal person having public responsibilities or functions, or providing public services, under the control of a body or person falling within (a) or (b):

Member States may provide that when bodies or institutions are acting in a judicial or legislative capacity, they are not to be regarded as public authorities for the purposes of this Directive.

Low involvement of regional and local level representatives till now !!

 The implementation of INSPIRE needs to consider the broader context of existing initiatives which could contribute to ESDI

 The INSPIRE Work Programme should interface with those partnerships and initiatives where relevant and establish synergy\*
 concept of Spatial Data Interest

**Communities (SDIC)** 

\*e.g. GEOSS, GMES, GALILEO, GSDI,...

 SDIC bundle the human expertise of users, producers and transformers of spatial information, technical competence, financial resources and policies. Many SDIC exist today, generally organised by region, thematic issue or sector (industry).






# The role of Spatial Data Interest Communities (SDIC)

- submit/develop reference materials,
- allocate experts to the drafting teams (closed in April 05),
- collect and describe user requirements,
- participate in the review process,
- implement pilot projects
  - to test/revise/develop the draft Implementing Rules,
- make cost/benefit analysis
  - to assess costs of the draft Implementing Rules,
- contribute to awareness raising and training







# Decisions taken at 1st CT-DTs coordination meeting 16-17/02/2007 CONSULTATION ON INTERMEDIATE DOCUMENTS

- •
- Consultation with SDIC/LMO will be reinforced.
- SDIC/LMOs will be requested to comment on intermediate documents or to answer specific questions.
- The consultation will be launched (under request of a DT and approval of the CT) on the INSPIRE web site using on-line tools. The CT will be responsible to coordinate this process.
- Under request of the DT the consultation will be also used to address specific questions related to a better understanding of user requirements in specific fields.
- INSPIRE consultations will be open to ALL registered SDIC/LMOs.

#### **BUT**


- Still lack of activities and visibility on the EU scene !!






#### What INSPIRE means for the organization







#### What is seen as positive on INSPIRE









#### What you dislike in/on INSPIRE

### Prague seminar conclusions

- The high participation and spectrum of Czech GI and GII/SDI stakeholders reflect interest in INSPIRE.
- The thematic or regional infrastructures for spatial data and information considered in national or European context.
- The INSPIRE Directive is seen with positive expectations:
  - needed legal and coordination framework;
  - help to brige or remove barriers between sectors and institutions.
- Many responders wish to participate in the INSPIRE development and implementation planning process >>>
  - participation in the <u>reviewing</u> (or testing) of the <u>drafted IRs</u> via registered SDIC/LMO and JRC;
  - informed participation in the national implementation planning process coordinated by CENIA and MICR;
  - using Nemoforum, the national platform for spatial information and cadastre, for horizontal communication.

- INSPIRE is a Directive with implementing rules to be defined in the coming years

  - including formal public consultation
